HELPFUL INFORMATION

Television: 7 & 9, Digital southwestern satellite signal, depends on site.

Propane: We fill tanks and motorhomes 10:00 am - 8:00 pm. Pounds or gallons.

Showers Building: Handicap Accessible, 50¢ for 5-6 minutes of hot water, well water limited.

Changing table for babies. Silk Stocking Shower House has family restrooms/shower stalls--one stop shop for the whole family. Lines may be shorter in park shower house.

Firewood: Available at concession stand.

Bicycles: Helmets are encouraged and riding after dark requires a light.

Speed Limit: Keep speed to 5 mph. *Enforced!* We have many children, but none to spare.

Daily Guests: Guests pay the daily admission fee and must be registered by 7:00 pm at main gate if staying overnight with a seasonal camper.

Laundry: Coin operated washers dryers are located inside the Silk Stocking Shower Building, Campers' Pavilion, and Buzzard's Hollow. Bring your supplies or use coin operated soap dispensers.

Trash: Receptacles are located throughout the park. Please leave your area clean.

Nature's Pets: Please secure your food and trash properly. Animals will eat unsecured food. Raccoons are wild!

Campsite Check-In: Mon-Sat 12:00 noon • Sun 4:00 pm.

Campsite Check-Out: Mon-Thurs 12:00 noon - *if site not reserved, stay until 4:00 pm - Check Availability.*

Fri-Sat 12 noon • Sun 12:00 noon - *if site not reserved, stay until 4:00 pm - Check Availability.*

\$5.00 Early Check-In fee. Morning before 12:00 noon; only if your site is vacant.

Golf Cart Check-In and Check-Out: The carts check-in and out are based on the basic check-in and check-out for times. No extensions available regardless of future rentals. Rental time 12 noon to 12 noon - 2 day minimum.

Campsite Deposit/Refund: All campsite reservations require a one-night deposit. Paid in full in advance will speed check-in. A \$10.00 handling fee will be charged on all cancellations. A refund will be given to cancellations made at least 14 days in advance.

Cabin Check-In: 3:00 pm **Cabin Check-Out:** 12:00 noon. No late check-out.

Cabin Deposit/Refund: All reservations require a one-night deposit at time of reservation. Holidays paid in full in advance will speed up check-in. A \$25.00 handling fee will be charged to all cancellations. A refund will be given to cancellations made at least 30 days in advance.

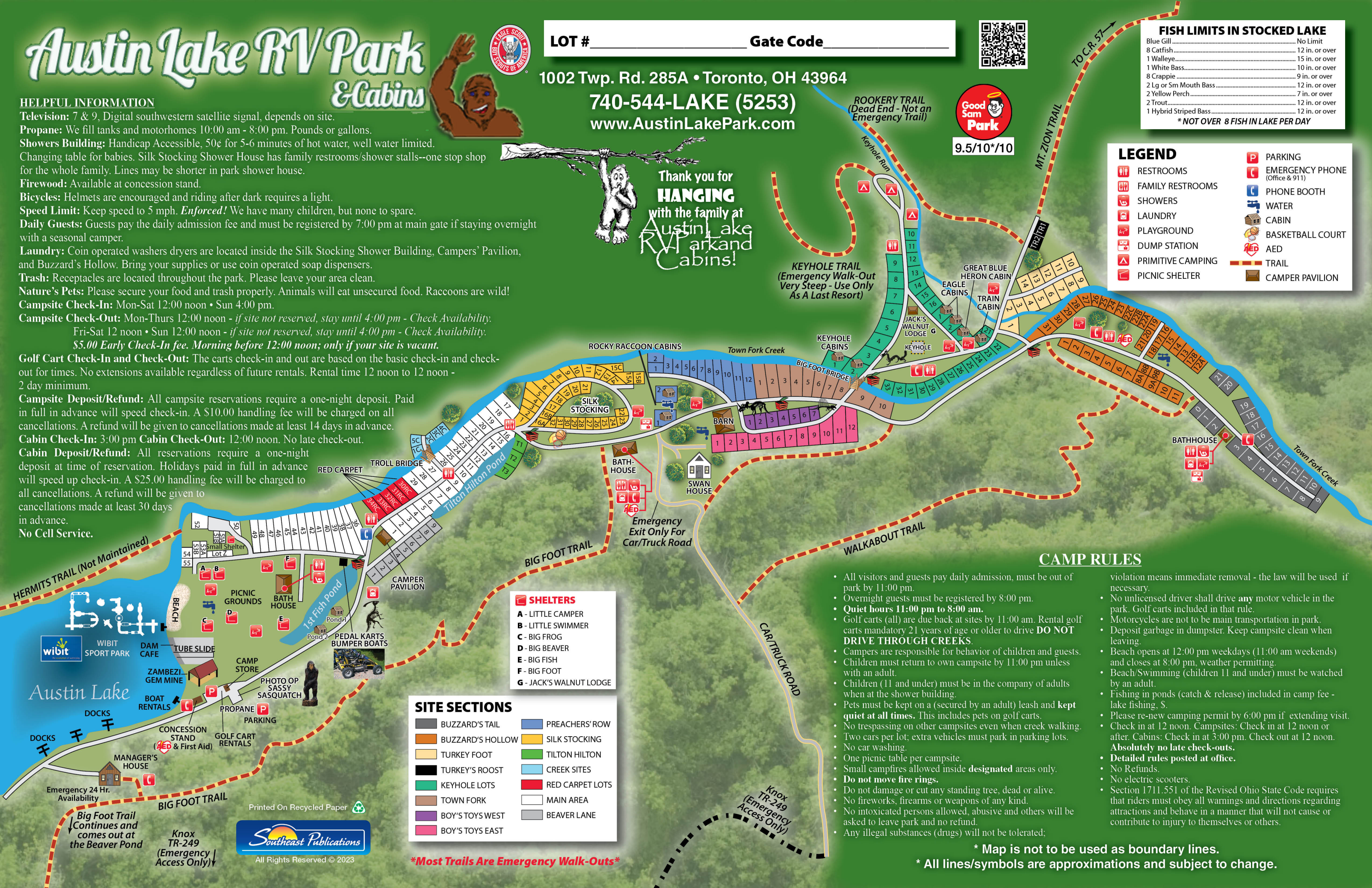

CAMP RULES

- All visitors and guests pay daily admission, must be out of park by 11:00 pm.
- Overnight guests must be registered by 8:00 pm.
- **Quiet hours 11:00 pm to 8:00 am.**
- Golf carts (all) are due back at sites by 11:00 am. Rental golf carts mandatory 21 years of age or older to drive **DO NOT DRIVE THROUGH CREEKS.**
- Campers are responsible for behavior of children and guests.
- Children must return to own campsite by 11:00 pm unless with an adult.
- Children (11 and under) must be in the company of adults when at the shower building.
- Pets must be kept on a (secured by an adult) leash and **kept quiet at all times.** This includes pets on golf carts.
- No trespassing on other campsites even when creek walking.
- Two cars per lot; extra vehicles must park in parking lots.
- No car washing.
- One picnic table per campsite.
- Small campfires allowed inside **designated** areas only.
- **Do not move fire rings.**
- Do not damage or cut any standing tree, dead or alive.
- No fireworks, firearms or weapons of any kind.
- No intoxicated persons allowed, abusive and others will be asked to leave park and no refund.
- Any illegal substances (drugs) will not be tolerated;

- violation means immediate removal - the law will be used if necessary.
- No unlicensed driver shall drive **any** motor vehicle in the park. Golf carts included in that rule.
- Motorcycles are not to be main transportation in park.
- Deposit garbage in dumpster. Keep campsite clean when leaving.
- Beach opens at 12:00 pm weekdays (11:00 am weekends) and closes at 8:00 pm, weather permitting.
- Beach/Swimming (children 11 and under) must be watched by an adult.
- Fishing in ponds (catch & release) included in camp fee - lake fishing, \$.
- Please re-new camping permit by 6:00 pm if extending visit.
- Check in at 12 noon. Campsites: Check in at 12 noon or after. Cabins: Check in at 3:00 pm. Check out at 12 noon. **Absolutely no late check-outs.**
- **Detailed rules posted at office.**
- No Refunds.
- No electric scooters.

✓ ACTIVITIES INFORMATION

- Armband Pass (\$)** Purchase at Boat Window for daily access to kayaks, paddle boats, pedal karts, tube slide, and Water Obstacle Course Inflatables. Age & Height restrictions apply to certain features. Rules & waiver must be signed by an adult at time of purchase.
- Kayaks & Paddleboats** (ARMBAND or \$) PFDs are required and children under 12 must have adult on boat. No swimming from boats.
- Berg Buster Pedal Karts** (ARMBAND or \$) Stay on the roads in your kart. Children under 4 may ride on an attached back seat with a parent only. Follow rules of the road.
- Tube Slide** (Armband or \$) Dry slide. Open hours announced. For ages 4 and up. Must carry tube back up the dam.
- Water Obstacle Course Inflatables** (\$ ARMAND) Purchase Armband and sign waiver at boat window. See Beach Attendant for lifejacket. When busy, 45-minute rotations put in place. Must know how to swim. *Height Restrictions apply. PFD required. No flipping or diving.*
- Golf Cart Rental** (\$) Must be registered campers, licensed, & 21 or older to rent. Reserve online or at concession stand. Two day minimum. Check out and check in is at noon.
- Pontoon Rentals** (\$) Fishing Pontoons (9.9 hp) and Cruising (25hp) Pontoons. Tube can be added to a 25hp Rental. Full day or half day rental options. Reserve at the Concession Stand. *25hp: Driver must have boater's license OR be born after Jan. 1, 1985*
- Polywog Pond**--observe nature in its true sense! Frogs and Tadpoles!
- Playgrounds everywhere throughout the park!** Swings, slides, giant tires, crawling tubes, and more. Take a biking/hiking adventure to experience them all.
- Big Foot Trail, Walk-About, Keyhole & Great Blue Heron Rookery Trails** are hiking or biking expeditions for all levels. (Find Bigfoot!) See map on reverse side. Take water.
- Creeking** your way down Town Fork Creek--hunt for the orange crayfish and watch out for the mean Troll who guards the swinging bridge.
- Dog Swimming Area:** Pups who need a water adventure can swim at the boat ramp area! They will thank you for it!
- Metal Sculptures** made by local JVS Junior Class of Welding Students. Go on a hunt for them all and read about the fun dinosaur facts!
- Beach & Swimming** (Sorry, no dogs or Alcohol on the Beach. No diving!) Children under 12 must be supervised by adult. All inner tubes & Floaties must be kept in the shallow. *Only life-jackets issued to people going to and from Obstacle Course are permitted beyond the poles*
- Paddle Boards** (\$) Rent at the Boat Window. PFDs are required and children under 12 must have adult supervision. No swimming from boards.
- Bumper Boats** (\$) Pay at the First Fish Pond and enjoy squirting your friends and driving around the pond. Weather permitting.
- Saturday Night Hayrides & BINGO!** Stand next to the road to be picked up when you see the tractor coming. Bingo at Campers' Pavilion at 7 pm.
- Stroll or Bike** over two miles of campground area without even leaving the campground roadway and relax! Travel with a light after dusk! Consider helmets!
- Concession Stand**-- Open from 10am-8pm, serving Hershey's Ice Cream, McConnell's burgers, fries, and many other favorites. (Hot food closes at 7:30) Also the hub to rent boats or buy armbands, bait, firewood, propane, or ice.
- Camper store** stocks souvenirs, toys, and many camping must-haves in case you've forgotten something from home. Take home an original Austin Lake T-shirt or sweatshirt.
- WiFi Internet** available limitedly throughout the park. Wifi is not for streaming and is weak.
- Basketball Courts, Gaga Ball, Sand Volleyball & Corn hole Boards!** Get the games started. Bring your own or borrow our equipment.
- Gem Mine** (\$) Zambezi River Mining Company. Buy your payload at the Camper Store and mine for gems and fossils!
- Birding**-- Observe the American Eagle, Red Tailed Hawk, Great Blue Heron, Canada Geese, & Wood Ducks.
- Fishing-2 Free Ponds, Pay Lake** (\$5/adult \$2/child) Ponds are Catch & Release. Lake Limits and other info at concession stand boat window. No night fishing on lake. State license not needed
- Weekly Activities** subject to change without notice: Hayrides and Bing Sat. at 7

Emergencies



Trinity West Hospital: Steubenville

Public Address System: Listen for announcements concerning general information and upcoming activities (see activity schedule)

Trinity Express Care: Wintersville, (740) 346-2702 (minor health issues)

Emergency Phones and Radios: Courtesy Phone for local calls at concession stand and in Phone Booth next to 100-ton Sand Pile. Cell phones work at top of Lake Hill. After hours (9 p.m.) available phone at the manager's house in an emergency. *Emergency calls & messages coming in for campers will be passed on.*

Ambulance/Fire Department: Dial 911. Alert Management ASAP.

Emergency Phones located at Concession Stand by Gate, Silk Stocking Shower Building, Buzzards' Hollow, Buzzard's Tail, and Keyhole-911 + Info to office (24 hours). Life-guard, management, & maintenance carts have communication radios.

First Aid: AED located at Concession Stand, Silk Stocking, & Buzzards Hollow Shower Building. Other Supplies also at Concession Stand. Limited supplies with lifeguard on beach. First Aid kits and fire extinguishers on maintenance carts.

Pets/Veterinarians: Crestview, Wintersville 264-3339; Two Ridge Clinic, Wintersville, 264-6320 (see map); Weekends- Animal Urgent Care, Wheeling, WV 304-233-0002; Met Vet (ER One) Robinson Twp, PA 412-788-6400

Emergency Evacuation! See other side of this map! Follow Walkout Trails. Maps posted in park. Listen for announcements on the PA system. If the power is out, there will be no PA system

Guests will be alerted with procedures based on emergency evacuation plan. Become familiar with the map on reverse side and know where emergency evacuation routes are located.

Heavy Rains Procedures:

- Management monitors lake levels
- Swimming will close
- Release of water from lake into creek in addition to what goes over spillway: standard normal procedure
- Creek will rise quickly and be swift
- Recommended that no one goes into creek during high water due to swift conditions and rocky debris
- Water can be even with or over the creek banks

Lightening Procedure: Swimming area, Water/Lake Activities, & Pedal Karts

In the event of thunder and/or lightening, everyone will be called out of water and all boats should return to shore.

Pedal Karts should be parked.

After 30 consecutive minutes without thunder, activities may resume. Lifeguards will make the decision. Listen to PA for announcements.

Dam is supervised 24 hours

Richmond, Sat. 6 pm; Sun. 9 am

Quiet Hours: 11 pm-8 am. Park Golf Carts by 11 pm. Children should be back at campsite by 11 pm unless with an adult.

Dogs: Must be leashed at all times. This includes on golf carts. No dogs on the beach, please. Please clean up after pets. Special swimming area for dogs at the boat ramp.

Beach Hours: Weekends: 11 am - 8 pm, Weekdays: 12 noon - 8 pm. May close due to weather. Children under 12 need adult supervision.

Fishing: No charge in all 3 ponds-- catch and release, be careful not to harm the fish. Pay for lake fishing at the boat window.

Pay Lake - \$10 Adults, \$5 Children. State license not needed. If keeping, limits on size and amount posted at concession stand. No night fishing on the lake, ponds okay. If you want to fish early morning and rent a boat, make arrangements the night before. Life jackets mandatory. (PFD)

Rental Equipment for Park: Volleyball, basketballs, Refundable \$ Deposit **or** Driver's license needed to rent.

Hiking & Mt. Biking--Take water:

- Big Foot Trail**- Steep incline to begin, 3/4 mile, great for family, *follow marked trail*, shorts okay!
- Great Blue Heron Rookery**- 90% level with short climbs, ends at Great Blue Heron Rookery, approx. .5 mile.
- Mt. Zion Trail**- Head into Turkey Foot & head straight up hill. Gorgeous but IS a climb!
- Keyhole Trail**- Steep incline to begin. Trail head in back of primitive camping to the left. Look for open, grassy clearing. Dead ends for turnaround return; can be used as emergency evacuation.
- Buzzards' Hollow Walkabout Trail**- Includes hills, follow signs, stay on Austin Lake property.

Hayrides: Saturdays, 7 pm, When you see the tractor coming, stand next to road to be picked up. Several runs will go if wagon is full. May be cancelled due to weather. **Responsible adult must accompany children under 12.**

Bingo: *Usually* Saturdays, 7 pm Announcement will be made.

Pancake Breakfasts: Once a month, Saturday 8-10 am. Bring your own table service. No charge (camper organized). Pancakes, syrup, 1 sausage, coffee, milk or juice. Come Early!
